

RETURN to an Address presented to His Majesty by The Honourable the House of Commons, requesting that He would be graciously pleased to give directions that there should be laid before the House the following Returns from all His Majesty's Colonies in the West Indies; and from the Isle of France and the Cape of Good Hope; viz.

A Return of the number of Slaves imported under licenses, or otherwise, since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year, and the sex of the Slaves so imported; together with the places from which they were brought.

A Return of the number of Slaves exported under licenses, or otherwise, since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year, and the sex of the Slaves exported; and specifying the places for which they were cleared out.

A Return of all Manumissions effected by purchase, bequest, or otherwise, since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year, and the sex of the Persons manumitted; together with a Statement of the amount of the Tax or Fine imposed on each manumission.

A Return of the number of Marriages legally solemnized between Slaves, and also between free Black or Coloured Persons since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year.

A List of all Persons committed to Gaols or Workhouses as Runaways, but who declared themselves to be free, since the 1st of January 1808; with an account of the final disposal of such Persons.

A Return of the Slaves escheated to the Crown since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year, and the Males from the Females; and stating the manner in which they have been disposed of; and if they have been sold, the manner and proceeds of their sale.

A Return of the Population in each year, from 1812 inclusive, to the latest period to which the same has been made up; with the number of Births and Deaths in each year; distinguishing the White, and the free Black, or Coloured, from the Slave population; distinguishing also the Sexes; and, as far as the same can be ascertained, the number of those below ten years of age, from the number of those above that age.

A Return of all Slaves taken and sold under execution for Debt in each year, from the 1st of January 1818 inclusive, till the latest period to which such Return can be made.

DISPOSAL OF PROCEEDS.

- (a) In consequence of the situation of casual Receiver having been vacant for a considerable time prior to my appointment to that office, and my several predecessors from the 1st of January 1808 having either died or left the Island without placing on record any return of Slaves escheated to the Crown, and sold by them during their administration, I am unable to furnish any return from the 1st of January 1808 to the 22d October 1819.
- (b) As there were certain claims against the estate of Michone Bontemp, letters of administration were granted to me, subject to the payment of such debts; in consequence of which the property of the estate was disposed of, and the balance, after payment of the said debts, amounting to 578 l. 18s. 3d. currrency, was granted by his Excellency Governor Whittingham as a loan to the colony, for forwarding the building of the protestant church.
- (c) As there were certain claims against the estate of Susan Laville, letters of administration were granted to me, subject to the payment of such debts; in consequence of which the property of the estate was disposed of, and the balance, after payment of the said debts, amounting to 409 l. 19s. currency, was granted by his Excellency Governor Whittingham as a loan to the colony for forwarding the building of the protestant church.

I HAVE had the honour of receiving your Lordship's circular letter of the 18th of July last, signifying the King's pleasure that I should furnish your Lordship with the Returns required in an accompanying copy of an address, which had been presented to His Majesty by The House of Commons, in order to their being laid before the Honourable House; I now beg leave to transmit the Returns therein alluded to, which (with the exception of the number of slaves imported under license, or otherwise, into the port of Sr. George's, and of which no record is kept by the officers of His Majesty's customs) will, I trust, afford the information called for.

WE have the honour of your Excellency's commands, requiring us to furnish returns of slaves imported herein under license, and also of slaves exported from hence in a similar manner, from the 1st of January 1808 to the present date; in pursuance of a resolution of the Honourable the House of Commons of the 3d of July last.

In reply to which, we have the honour to state, that no directions having ever been received here to keep such accounts, there are no documents in this office from which such return of negroes imported could be made out; and with respect to negroes so exported, we should be similarly situated, but from the circumstance of the bonds entered into previous to such licenses being granted, enabling us to furnish the return required for the periods for which such bonds remain in the office.

Sir, Parsonage Cottage, Carriacou, 17 Sept. 1821. THE honour of your Excellency's commands was not received till yesterday.

The legal solemnization of a marriage between slaves in this island is a thing unheard of; and if I might presume to offer my sentiments, would, in their present state of imperfect civilization, lead to no beneficial result. Their affection for each other, if affection it can be called, is capricious and short lived; restraint would hasten its extinction; and unity without harmony is mutual torment.

The total number of marriages between free coloured persons, (for there has occurred no marriage between free black persons), is, as your Excellency will observe by the inclosed detail, only nine, and two of that number not parishioners; but married by your Excellency's license. Our wealthy coloured population has dwindled away almost to nothing.

I HAVE the honour to transmit to your Excellency returns of the population of this colony, in obedience to the directions of Earl Bathurst, as signified by your Excellency on the 8th ultimo.

In explanation of the delay that has taken place in making out these returns, I beg leave to observe, that the documents on which they are grounded, though lodged in my office, are not directed to be transcribed into any book of record, and are not so transcribed excepting when any of the objects specified therein are rated or taxed by the House of Assembly. I have in consequence been compelled to examine every return of each year, under what is termed the Population Act of 1801; and to remedy any defects or omissions therein by resorting to private and extraneous information, when within my reach. These circumstances, together with the requisite details and duties of the office, will, I trust, be received as an apology, not only for the lateness of this communication, but also for any inaccuracies that may be discovered in the returns, should any be found to exist.

Copy of a Letter from Governor Sir Chas Brisbane to the Earl Bathurst, dated St. Vincent, the 3d of November 1821:- Enclosing 7 Returns.

Government House, St. Vincent, 3d November 1821. My Lord,

I HAVE the honour to transmit to your Lordship the several returns required by the Resolutions of the House of Commons of the 3d of July last. I have to observe, that it was a work of great labour, in some of the offices, to go back so many years, which will account for the time that has elapsed since the receipt of your Lordship's despatch, dated the 18th of July last. Every exertion has been used to make out the information required, with as much accuracy as possible; and I trust your Lordship will be satisfied that no time has been lost in endeavouring to comply with your Lordship's directions.

COPY of a Letter from Governor Sir Henry Warde to the Earl Bathurst, K. G. dated Barbadoes, the 9th of November 1821 :- Enclosing 14 Returns.

My Lord. Barbadoes, 9th Nov. 1821. WITH reference to the letter your Lordship did me the honour to write on the 18th of July, which conveyed the copy of an address to His Majesty from the House of Commons, requesting certain returns from the colonies; immediately on the receipt of which I gave directions to have the returns prepared, in compliance with your Lordship's instructions: I have, however, to regret, that in consequence of there being no law in this colony for taking a census of the people, I am solely under the necessity of depending on the information of the several clergymen of parishes, as stated in the accompanying eleven returns received from them.

I have further to state, for your Lordship's information, that I am unable to comply with the paragraph requiring a list of persons committed to gaol or workhouses as runaways, but who declared themselves free, there being no such persons on record at the provost marshal's office.

May it please Your Excellency,

In obedience to the resolution of the House of Commons, transmitted by Lord Bathurst, I have caused the records of the Secretary's Office to be diligently searched, and find the number of persons manumitted, according to the above statement, to be 1,713. From 1808 to 1816, the fine or tax paid by the person manumising a slave was for a female 300 l. and for a male 200 l.; and during that period there appears to have been only fifteen persons manumitted, according to the colonial law. On the 19th of August 1816, the above Act was repealed, and an Act limiting the fine or tax on persons manumising slaves to 50 l. revived; from which period to the 30th of September last, there appears to have been 250 persons manumitted according to the colonial law; the remaining number has been (with few exceptions) enfranchised by persons in England, who have there granted manumissions to Slaves conveyed to them for that purpose; which manumissions being proved before some mayor, or other proper constituted authority, are sent here; and on being recorded are allowed to be valid. These last manumissions are effected at a very trifling expense.

I have further to inform your Excellency, that the fines of 300 l. and 200 l. entitled the persons manumitted under them, the one to an annuity of 18 l. and the other to 12 l., and the fine of 50 l. to an annuity of 4 l. annually, during their natural lives.

COPY of a Letter from Governor Sir B. D'Urban to the Earl Bathurst; dated Antigua, the 5th of December 1821:—Enclosing 10 Returns.

Government-House, Antigua, 5th December 1821. My Lord, I HAVE the honour to transmit herewith the Returns required by your Lordship's circular letter of the 18th of July, with its enclosure. Some of these Returns are perfectly accurate; others, I am afraid, not altogether so, but they are all as correct as the existing records have admitted of.

Nº 1. Contains the Returns of Slaves imported and exported since the 1st of The Letter annexed to them, from the chief officers of His Majesty's customs, will fully explain to your Lordship why these Returns are, to a certain degree, deficient; nor am I aware of any means within my power of rendering them less so.

Nº 2. Is a Return of the manumissions since the 1st of January 1808. quite accurate, and your Lordship will perceive that no tax or fine is imposed upon manumissions in Antigua.

Nº 3. Is a Schedule of Marriages legally solemnized between coloured and black people since the 1st of January 1808; taken from the Returns furnished by the respective clergymen of the established church, which are annexed to it. respect to the marriages of slaves, I request to refer your Lordship to the observations in the letters of the several clergymen, accompanying the Returns, and especially to those of the Reverend Messrs. Harman and Coull.

Nº 4. Is a Return of persons committed to gaols or workhouses. Your Lordship will perceive that no record exists of persons of this description before the 29th of December 1812.

Nº 5. Is a Return of slaves sold under execution for debt since the 1st of January 1808. Your Lordship will observe that of the number so sold, amounting 360 were sold together with the estates on which they respectively to 790, resided.

N° 6. Is a Report from the escheator-general, by which it appears that no slaves have been escheated to the Crown since the 1st of January 1808.

No 7. Contains, 1st. the white and free coloured and black population, taken from a census made in the present year 1821.

There is no record existing of this population from the year 1812 to the year

1820 inclusive, no census having been taken during that period.

Your Lordship will observe, that these Returns are made in the treasurer's office, and as they are for the purposes of taxation, they are probably smaller in registry, nor in the amount than the actual slave population, as some individuals will endeavour to gain period intervening between its trienmal exemption by returning as few slaves as they may find practicable; and this supbetween its trienmal exemption by returning as few slaves as they may find practicable; and this supbetween its trienmal exemption to be a supplementary to be a supplementa amount than the actual slave population, as some individuals will endeavour to gain position will be borne out by comparing the amount of the slave population taken the slave population, from the slave registry of 1818 and 1821, (annexed) with the Returns at the but these returns, treasurer's office for the same years respectively. For the former of these years there appears a difference of 2,438, for the latter, of 1990.

A Schedule of the number of births and deaths respectively since the year 1812, so far as they can be ascertained from the registers of infant baptisms, and It is probable, that of funerals thereto annexed; the only means which I am aware of for that purpose with regard to the

slave population, the births will have considerably exceeded the baptisms; and (although in a smaller degree) the deaths may have exceeded the funerals.

> Upon this subject of population I request to say to your Lordship, in conclusion, that by reference to the Journals of the House of Assembly of Antigua, I have found the "Report of a Select Committee appointed to ascertain the Population of " the Island, in consequence of an application from the House of Commons to His " Majesty, communicated by letter from the Secretary of State to his Excellency

From this Report (which is of course in the port-folio of your Lordship's department) it appears, that in January 1811, the population amounted to

2,102 White inhabitants, 2,185 Free coloured and black, 28,317 Slaves.

Hence, by referring to the documents contained in the Enclosure Nº 7, the comparative population of the years 1811 and 1821, will be as follows:

Now this increase of slaves is obviously by propagation; for by the Returns in the Enclosure, No 1, it will be seen that the exports of slaves from the Island, since 1811 have exceeded the imports into it by 120: and your Lordship will observe, that in making this comparison, I have not taken the slave population of 1821 from the slave registry (which is the true state, amounting to 31,064, and therefore exceeding that which I have assumed by 1,990) but from the Returns in the treasurer's office; and this because the estimate for 1811 (given in the Report of the Select Committee) is drawn from the same source; and as these Returns for the purposes of taxation fall short of the real slave population for the years 1818 and 1821 respectively, (as I have shown in a former part of this letter) it is to be inferred that from the same causes that of 1811 would do so too. Each of these states, therefore, although neither of them accurate, probably bear an equal proportion to the true population of the year, and may consequently serve as a tolerably just basis of comparison. At any rate, the unquestionable result of investigating them is, that in the last eleven years subsequent to the Abolition Act the slave population of Antigua has very considerably increased, notwithstanding the balance of exports has been against it.

We have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Excellency's letter of the 11th instant, with its enclosure, and in compliance with the directions contained therein have made up the Returns called for in as accurate a manner as the documents now in office will allow; but we deem it necessary to inform your Excellency that the accounts of Imports and Exports for the years 1808 and 1809, are not in office; nor could they be found on the admission of the present collector and comptroller in 1818, which circumstance has prevented them, in two or three instances, from furnishing accounts called for by the Honourable Board of Customs, that occurred in the years above mentioned; your Excellency will perceive the Imports and Exports of Slaves for those years are returned Nil; this information the acting comptroller obtained from the books of the naval officer, by request of the acting collector; and the statements made subsequent to the years 1808 and 1809, are from the entries in the inwards and outwards books, now in our possession.

We regret that we cannot furnish your Excellency with the number of males and females, in all the cases stated in the returns; as, in many instances, the number of slaves only, without regard to their sex, have alone been attended to; but this occurred before our time, as will be seen by the returns, and for which we cannot be accountable. We apprehend, that previous to the Registration Act our predecessors in office were not particular in noting in the Imports and Exports of Slaves their sex; but merely stating, as appears by the office books, their number; yet we have every reason to feel confident that the returns now transmitted to your Excellency are correct as it regards the total number of slaves Imported into and Exported from this Island

In obedience to your Excellency's commands, by your letter of the 11th instant, to prepare a Return of the number of marriages between Slaves, and also between free black or coloured persons, from the register of the parish of Saint Mary (under my superintendance) since the 1st of January 1808, distinguishing each year; I have examined the said register, and have the honour to report as follows; viz. That from the 1st of January 1808, to the 1st of January 1820, i.e. for the space of twelve years, I do not find one single couple of the above description to have been married in the said parish: That I was inducted to the said benefice only in August 1819; and that in the following year, viz. 1820, I married by banns one free coloured couple, and in this present year 1821, I married one free coloured couple by license; but that I married no slaves as yet in my capacity of rector of a parish.

Such I humbly conceive is the answer required to your present letter; and have the honour

I beg also to observe, that, within the period above mentioned I have married several couple of slaves in my station as the Missionary from the established church, of which I do not suppose any Return is required in your Excellency's present letter; and with great deference express my opinion, that the real interest and welfare of the colony would be more safely and more naturally provided for by committing the ministration of the solemn ordinances for slaves, and more particularly that of the marriage of slaves, to the care of the clergy of our national church—I mean under proper restrictions and regulations.

I HAD the honour to receive your Excellency's letter yesterday, at a late hour in the evening, and in answer thereto I beg leave to inform your Excellency that during the space of thirty years I never knew or heard that any marriages were performed by clergymen of the church of England in this Island between slaves. I have been Rector of the Parish of St. Philip about eighteen years, and have never been applied to to officiate at the marriage of slaves.

With respect to the marriages of free black or coloured persons since the 1st of January

1808, I have the following information to give your Excellency;

During the years 1808, 1809, 1810, 1811, 1812, 1813 and 1814, I married no free black or coloured persons.

In the year 1815, I married one couple only of free coloured persons. In the year 1816, I married one couple of the same description. In the year 1817, I married one couple of the same description.

In the years 1818 and 1819, I married no free black or coloured persons.

In 1820, I married two couple of free people of colour, and another couple of free people, the bridegroom being a fair man of colour, and the bride a black woman.

During this present year I have married no free black or coloured persons.

Antigua, 26th September 1821. In obedience to the letters your Excellency has honoured me with I have enclosed the cturns you have been pleased to require to be laid before the House of Commons.

I entreat your Excellency will pardon the liberty I have taken in troubling you with the reasons for my declining to marry two slaves, particularly as it happened only four or five

weeks before your Excellency's arrival here.

During forty-two years and nine months that I have been Rector and Incumbent of the Parish of St. George, I had never been called upon to marry any slaves, till, on the 29th of April 1820, the honourable and Reverend Richard Burgh Byam wrote to me, requesting me to publish the banns of marriage between two mulatto slaves, belonging to the estate of William Byam, Esq. his father, but in the possession of mortgagees, of which he had the direction. I complied with his request, and published the banns. But on due consideration that neither of the parties had applied to me to marry them; and being assured, by undoubted authority, that the woman was twice the age of the man, of a licentious character,

character, and been faithful to none of several husbands, for whilst she had a mestee husband she had a child by a black man; and afterwards, when she had a coloured husband, she had another child by a white man; and a third child, all of different colours, and was remarkable for her infidelity; and no marriage being lawful here unless solemnized by a minister of the church of England, and he cannot marry a free person to a slave under a penalty of 50 l.; and that the Amelioration Act, passed at St. Christopher's by the General Assembly, and confirmed by the King the 6th of March 1799, N° 36 of our laws, sections Assembly, and communed by the King the Oth Materia 1799, it 35 of Oth laws, seeking 22d, 23d, 24th, and 25th, point out regulations and remunerations to slaves assuming the relation of man and wife: That I might act legally and rightly, I waited upon and consulted his Honour the Commander in Chief, and His Majesty's Attorney and Solicitor Generals, who were of opinion, that as no such request had ever before been made me, and a solicitor of the commander in Chief. ficed clergyman had ever married any slaves, and neither the man nor woman had applied to me to marry them, I would act improperly by solemnizing it.

I wrote to Mr. Byam, and stated my reasons for not complying further with his request, and as he did not marry them, I conceive he was actuated by the same motives.

I understand that my refusal to marry the two slaves has been reported in England, but I know not in what light. I hope therefore your Excellency will not consider this representation of facts as either unnecessary or obtrusive.

I HAVE the honour to enclose, agreeably to your Excellency's desire, Returns of the Marriages of free people of colour, from the 1st day of January 1808 to the 11th day of September last, distinguishing the number in each year; and also Returns of the Baptisms and Burials of free people and of slaves, from the year 1812 to the above date of the 11th day of September, distinguishing the sexes, as extracted from the registers of the respective parishes of Saint John and Saint Paul in this Island, to be laid before the House of Commons pursuant to the communication of Earl Bathurst to your Excellency.

Your Excellency will perceive that there is not any marriage of slaves in either Return; there is not a single instance of any such occurrence on record in either register, the circumstance having been invariably considered as illegal; nor is it easy to conceive how so solemn and binding a contract can possibly be entered into by persons who are not free agents.

The late Mr. Thomas Norbury Kirby was my predecessor; and I have made due inquiry at the office of the Secretary of the Island, where the proceedings of all such matters are duly recorded, and I find that no escheat to the Crown has taken place, or a court held since the 1st day of January 1808.

Custom House, Tobago, 1st of November, 1821.

I HAD the honour of receiving your Excellency's letter of yesterday's date, requiring for the information of His Majesty's Ministers, certain Returns; viz.

A Return of the number of Slaves Imported under Licenses, or otherwise, since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year, and the sex of the slaves so imported; together with the places from which they were brought.

A Return of the number of Slaves Exported, or otherwise, since the 1st of January 1808; distinguishing each year, and the sex of the slaves exported; and specifying the places for which they were cleared out.

In reply thereto, I have the honour to acquaint your Excellency that I minutely examined the different books and records now in this office, and to state to your Excellency that no documents can be found from which such returns can be collected.

It does not appear that the principal officers of His Majesty's Customs have hitherto been required, either by Act of Parliament, by letter from the Honourable the Board of Commissioners, or otherwise, to make any specific entry or clearance of slaves imported

into or exported from this Colony.

No slaves have been captured by any of His Majesty's ships, and placed under the charge

of any of the collectors here, during the period alluded to.

My Lord, Demerara, 6th February 1822.

IN obedience to your Lordship's command, I have the honour to transmit certain Returns (which are as accurate as I could obtain them) required for the purpose of

being laid before the House of Commons.

Your Lordship will perceive a considerable gradually-operating reduction in the sums required to be deposited by those who apply for the manumission of slaves. Freedom is often given gratis, or for small deposits, when the reward of distinguished merit, or obtained by parties who have lived in reputed freedom, with fair charac-Large sums are sometimes imposed after mature deliberation upon the situation of the slave; the circumstances of those who apply in their behalf, and, not unfrequently, their irregular connection with them. These sums are thrown into the poors fund, upon which they have an indisputable claim, when circumstances compel them to seek assistance. This fund is swelled from other powerful sources, and when these prove insufficient the deficiency is made up from the public purse.

I regret my inability to procure any Return of Population, Females or Children, Whites, or free Coloured, for the periods required. I have the honour to be, &c.

REMARKS:

No entry of marriage appears on the register of St. George's Chapel, previous to 1812, between the classes of persons before mentioned; and there is reason to think that no such marriage was ever solemnized before that date.

The marriages of slaves is a thing unheard of in this colony; and I humbly conceive this holy institution to be altogether incompatible with the state of slavery under existing laws and regulations. The diminution of the number of marriages, according to the rites and ceremonies of the church of England, among an increasing population, which has ever evinced a strong attachment to our forms,

is much to be lamented; but can admit of no amendment while the ministers of the Dutch reformed, and Scotch presbyterian churches, enjoy the privilege of marrying by banns proclaimed in church, a privilege not enjoyed by the established church of England, which has been obliged to adhere to regulations which are tedious and expensive, consequently detrimental to her interests.

IN answer to the communication I had the honour to receive from you on the 26th November, I beg to observe, that as I am not of the Established Church, marriages solemnized by me would not be legal; I have therefore refused to comply with the requests of the free black and coloured people, and have not married any of them: but as the slaves have no legal inheritance, they could suffer no loss or inconvenience from their marriages not being considered legal; and knowing by experience that marriages among negroes promote morality, economy, and domestic happiness, I have married a great number of them, but have not kept a regular list of marriages until the last two years; which is as follows:

Note:—In the above Return I have comprehended under the head "Coloured People" all who are descended by one of their parents from the race of Free Indians, as well as those that are of Negro extraction. Besides these intermarriages between persons of the same class, two young women of colour have been united by me in lawful wedlock to white young men, on which account they are not included in the number before specified.

As for slaves, I should not consider myself justified in celebrating marriage between them, without previous assurance, obtained from competent authority, that such practice is conformable to the existing laws and regulations of the colony; and, moreover, without being certified in each particular case, that the owner of such slave or slaves did not object to that sort of union.

IN reply to the letter I had the honour of receiving from you last week, I have to state, that not being a minister of the established church of England, I have not considered myself authorized to solemnize marriage in a legal sense; though, with a view of rendering the negroes who attend my ministry more moral, &c. I have required them to make a solemn promise of fidelity, &c. to each other; which a great many of them have done, but of these I have kept no particular record.

From my arrival in this colony in January 1809, not more than two or three couples of poor free people have been thus united by me, as wherever any property was concerned

I have advised my hearers to be married by the established clergy.

I am the first that occupied this station, and have no former records to refer to.

My Lord, King's House, Berbice, 2d April 1822.

In obedience to your Lordship's commands of the 18th of July last, requiring certain Returns regarding the Slaves in this Colony, as set forth in an address of the House of Commons of the 3d of that month, to the King, I now have the honour of transmitting to your Lordship the following documents:

(A.)—Return of the Collector and Comptroller of the Customs of all Slaves Imported and Exported into and out of this Colony, from January 1808 to the

31st of December 1821.

(B.)—Return of the Colonial Secretary of Manumissions effected between the

4th of April 1808 and the 4th of October 1820.

(C.)—Return of the Colonial Secretary of Slaves taken and sold under Execution for Debt, from the 1st of January 1818 to the 3d of December 1821.

(D.)—A Statement of the White, Free Coloured, and Slave Population. In the hope that these documents will afford all the required information,

COPY of a Letter from Governor Maxwell to the Earl Bathurst; dated St. Christopher, 1st May 1822:—Enclosing 6 Returns.

My Lord, Government-House, St. Christopher, 1st May 1822.

I HAVE the honour to enclose to your Lordship the following Returns from this Island, agreeably to your Lordship's circular of the 18th of July last, addressed to Mr. President Wilson:

Nº 1. Return of Slaves Imported since 1808;

Nº 2. Return of Slaves Exported since 1808;

No 3. Return of Manumissions by purchase, &c. since 1808;

Nº 4. Return of Marriages legally solemnized since 1808;

Nº 5. Return of Slaves taken and sold since 1821 under Executions;

Nº 6. Return of slaves from the year 1812.—No slaves have been escheated to the Crown since 1808.

Your Lordship will observe, that the "Return of Slaves taken and sold, &c." is only furnished from the 1st of May 1820, the period when the present Deputy Provost Marshal entered on his duties. I have received no reply from his predecessor to my applications for the Returns previous to that date.

The Return of the Population of June 1812 will not embrace all the information required by the House of Commons, as the only date afforded for such information are the books kept by the churchwardens of the parishes; and as the object of any registration previous to the one established lately was merely to levy a polltax, several inaccuracies, arising from carelessness or evasions, must be attributed to each census.

I beg to assure your Lordship that I have made every exertion to procure the aforementioned returns as early as possible; and I have endeavoured to render them as clear and explicit as the several data on which they are framed would allow.

IN reference to my Despatch No. 10, I have the honour to forward the following Returns from the island of Tortola;

- N° 4. Return of Marriages since 1808;

No "slaves have been escheated to the Crown since 1808," or any "persons since that period been committed to gaol as runaways, but who declared themselves free," by the declaration of the Deputy Provost-Marshal. I beg leave to submit to your Lordship, that the illegal Importation and Exportation of slaves, stated in the Returns No 1 and 2, occurred prior to my arrival in this government; and that the first official intimation I have received of the transactions is from these Returns.

The President of Tortola informs me that he has endeavoured to make the Returns as correct as possible; and I venture to assure your Lordship that they may be considered as authentic as any that I can procure.

In the year 1812, a bill passed laying a fine of six pounds twelve shillings currency on Manumissions, and the money arising therefrom was appropriated to the payment of an annuity, allowed by bill to Mrs. Jane Turnbull, then the widow of the Honourable William Turnbull, formerly the President of His Majesty's Board of Council for the Virgin Islands; under which first-mentioned bill fourteen persons, and no more, paid the public tax on Manumissions; those persons manumitted during the continuance of the bill having declined recording the Manumissions. The said bill expired at the death of the said Mrs. Turnbull, which happened in September 1813. There has not been any other tax on Manumissions since the expiration of the last-mentioned bill.

Sir, Registrar of Slaves Office, 6th July 1822. ENCLOSED I have the honour to transmit to your Excellency the return of Imported and Exported slaves, as far as the same can be correctly made from the books of this office. In the Return of Imported slaves, I have given the places from which they were brought, together with the years, from the commencement of the registry to the 31st of December 1821. I have not specified the sexes, as the custom-house licenses from which the said Return has been made take no notice of the same; and it would be impossible to give a correct statement thereof by a reference to the books; as in the first place it could only be accomplished from 1815 to the end of 1818, it never having been stated at the first registrations in 1813, how the slaves were acquired; the word "imported" being only made use of at the subsequent registrations. In the next place, the whole number registered in the books would never correspond with the whole number taken from the custom-house licenses, as many of the slaves so imported (between any two periods of registration) have died, and consequently no mention ever made of them.

As for the Exported Slaves, the place for which they were cleared out has never been stated in the Returns, or entered in the books; therefore all the information that can be given

appears therein.

IN obedience to your Excellency's commands, I have the honour to transmit Returns of the Population of this Colony, from the year 1812 to 1821 inclusive; and as all the particulars required are not expressed, I beg leave to account for the same as follows:

The return of Births cannot be taken as correct, it not being the custom in this country, as in England, to baptize children at a very early age.

The return of Deaths, it is to be lamented, is much more deficient, as from there being no parish churches, except in the towns and Indian settlements, numbers are necessarily buried out of reach of the aid of religious rites; neither were parochial returns made until ordered by his Excellency the Governor, in the year 1817.

The above observations likewise apply to the slaves, in the Returns of whom, distinctions of sexes, or of the age at which deaths take place, were never kept previous to the registration.

COPY of a Letter from Governor Sir R. T. Farquhar, to the Earl Bathurst; dated Port Louis, Mauritius, the 7th of November 1822:—Enclosing 9 Returns.

My Lord, Port Louis, Mauritius, 7th November 1822. I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Lordship's Letter, N° 47, dated the 17th of July 1821, signifying the King's pleasure that I should immediately transmit to your Lordship the Returns relating to Slaves, which are more particularly specified in a copy of a Resolution of the House of Commons, dated the 3d of July 1821.

As this is the first time that Returns of this description have been called for, or even prepared, difficulties have necessarily arisen in the search that has been made for authentic documents relating to matters so remote, and partly appertaining to the French Government previously to the conquest. This will account for the ap-

parent delay in making the Returns required.

Your Lordship will observe, that these documents have been collected and prepared by the colonial archivist, with the assistance of the procureur-general, and the heads of the several civil and judicial departments, to which each one refers, and which has only been obtained by dint of much labour, and a very voluminous correspondence, and with all that personal exertion and unremitted attention on my own part, which the importance of the case seemed to require.

At the foot of each Return there will appear explanatory notes, which it is hoped

will be found satisfactory.

In one case, however, that of the Registrar of Slaves, I feel it my duty, in addition to the memorandums upon the Return itself, to observe more particularly, for your Lordship sinformation, that for the year 1814, the return is made from the Collector's Tax Roll, under the proclamation of the Governor; for the year 1815, from original Returns, under the Registration Order in Council; for 1819 from the Triennial Returns under the Order in Council. This is the last Triennial Return stated by the registrar to be yet complete.

The Registration Order in Council having in the year 1815 reached this colony,

and been duly published, the first census under it was made in that year.

The first Triennial Return was made in the year 1819, and the last, for the present year, is as yet incomplete. The Return, therefore, for 1815, is made comformably to the directions of the Honourable House. The subsequent Returns cannot be made out, as stated by the registrar, in the full detail required, without further time for search and examination, and comparison, in every instance, with the original registry; but that search and examination are by my orders in progress, and those returns will follow what I have now the honour of transmitting, as soon as possible.

I beg leave to enclose a copy of a letter from the Registrar of Slaves, explanatory of this circumstance, and of the difficulties of which he complains, together with my

minute thereon.

Your Lordship is already in possession of the opinion of the Chief Judge, as well as of that of the Registrar of Slaves himself, as to the embarrassments that must exist in this colony, until some legislative alterations and amendments shall have been effected in the provisions of the present order in council.

The Returns required of Births and Deaths of the Slave Population, distinguishing the sexes also, cannot be accurately procured, as the annual census taken by the civil commissaries, from which this information could be drawn, having been suspended agreeably to law by the registration order in council, there are no authentic

documents on the subject to refer to.

I may be permitted to observe, under this head, that the apparent falling off of the slave population, between the years 1815 and 1819, may probably be accounted for by the prevalence of that destructive disorder the cholera morbus, which raged at the conclusion of the latter year, and which carried off some thousands; and this visitation may also account, in some degree, for any delay or inconveniences which may possibly have arisen in furnishing the Returns in full detail for that year.

N° 1 to N° 8.

I have thought it desirable to advert to the probable cause of this apparently sudden decrease, lest it might lead to erroneous references, on the subject of the Slave Population of this colony; but I have every reason to hope and believe, that these islands will not form any exception to the acknowledged principle of the increase of population, save that which naturally results from the circumstance, that at the time of the conquest there was a disproportion between the sexes, exceeding that of two males for one female.

Tax or Fine imposed on each Manumission.

N. B. There is collected at the chief secretary's office a duty of twenty-five dollars on each enfranchisement by marriage, and ten dollars on all other enfranchisements. If the number of individuals enfranchised in the same act or instrument exceed two, then is the duty only five dollars each. The enfranchisements accorded by government are alone exempt from duty: but, further than this, a sum to the amount of one hundred dollars currency must be paid by the person granting the manumission, to the "Caisse de Bienfaisance;" and a further sum of two hundred dollars is deposited in trust, or security given in the office of the collector of the internal revenues, there to remain until two of the principal magistrates of the colony grant a certificate that the person manumitted can exercise some trade, or has otherwise some means sufficient to provide for himself and family; upon which the sum deposited is returned, or the security cancelled; and this is done to guard the parish against the persons so manumitted becoming paupers. Marriages between free persons and slaves are alone exempted from these deposits and securities. A simple certificate from a magistrate that the parties are in a state to support themselves is sufficient in these last cases.

made from the Collector's Tax Roll, under the proclamation of the Governor.-For the year 1815, from original Returns made under the Registration Order in Council.—For 1819, from the Triennial Returns under the Order in Council.— This is the last Triennial Return stated by the Registrar to be yet complete.

4. The Registration Order having suspended the Annual Returns from the Civil Commissioners, no means actually exist of ascertaining the Births and Deaths called for; and, moreover, the law previously required only such Returns to be made to the Civil Commissaries in cases of trusts.

Sir, Slave Registration Office, Port Louis, 9th October 1822.

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 8th instant, relative to the Return transmitted with my letter of the 24th ultimo; and I had hoped, from a verbal communication upon the subject with which his Excellency favoured me, that the statement forwarded with my letter contained the required information.

Every attention will undoubtedly be given to his Excellency's further commands, relative to the statement required, as communicated by your letter received this day; but I feel it necessary, as your letter requires the preparation of these documents with dispatch, to state, that it will be impossible to supply the detail now demanded for a considerable time, probably a period of some months; in the mean time I will state, for his Excellency's information, to what extent it will be in my power to comply with the instructions which I have just received. Within a comparative short space of time I shall be enabled, with little difficulty, to provide a statement which will contain full information upon the several points enumerated in your letter, as regards the original registry of 1815; viz. the number of male and female slaves, and the number of children under ten years of age. To provide a similar statement for 1819, a minute examination of all the triennial returns of that year must be made, with references, in every instance, to the original registry, in order to arrive at a correct separate list of male and female slaves, because the mutation returns contain only the names and descriptions of those slaves who have undergone mutations since the original census, there being no necessity for persons to bear on their triennial returns any slaves (still appertaining to the proprietor who originally recensed them) who have undergone no change since 1815; consequently the description of such slaves can only be obtained by reference to the original registrations. A list of children returned in 1819, under the age of ten years, could be supplied with no great difficulty.

I have considered it necessary, for the reasons already stated, the impossibility of providing, without considerable delay, the statements, in the full extent of detail specified in your letter. I conceive, however, that the principal difficulty which I have stated to exist, might be, in a great measure, removed, if, for the year 1819, a comparative statement of the number of male and female slaves, founded on the original census of 1815, from which it appears they were, as nearly as possible, in the proportion of two males to one female, could be admitted, the preparation of the statements would, in this case, not occupy more than ten days, or at most a fortuight. Should, however, this suggestion not receive his Excellency's sanction, every degree of diligence will be employed to provide the statements,

in the fullest detail, with all practicable dispatch.
