Note:—THE greater difference between the Number seized and the Number delivered to the Colonial Authorities, in 1821 and 1822, is accounted for principally by the accidental loss of the Ycanam Slave ship, whereby the greater number on board were drowned; and also, by the circumstance of the whole number of Slaves actually seized, being always stated since the Mixed Commission Courts were established in those years; whereas, the returns for the previous years from the ViceAdmiralty Court, show, in most instances, only the numbers brought alive into port, and proceeded against.
