B.—THE Duplicate Slave Returns in the *Mauritius*, for the year 1819, are so imperfect as not to afford any means whatever of ascertaining the amount of the Slave Population at that period, and have therefore been sent back to the Colony for correction. Those for the year 1822 are supposed to have been lost in the ship *George the Fourth*, wrecked on her voyage from the *Mauritius* in June last.
