EXTRACT of a Despatch from Lieutenant General the Honourable Sir G. Lowry Cole, c. c. b. to the Right Honourable Earl Bathurst, K. c. dated Mauritius, 31 December 1824.

"I HAVE great satisfaction in being able to state, that there is no reason to suppose that any Vessel under the *British* Flag is at all engaged in the Slave Trade."
