Extract of a Report from Governor Farquhar to the Right Honourable Earl of Liverpool, dated Port Louis, Mauritius, 28th July 1812; upon the Population of the Seychelles.

"THE Islands contain at present about Four Thousand Inhabitants, the Sixth part of which are Whites; and the Population is rapidly increasing."

Extract of a Report on the Seychelles; addressed by Lieut. Cole, of R. Staff Corps to L^t-Gen. Sir G. L. Cole.

—" THE Population, according to the Returns of January 1825, amounts to 6,963 Souls; consisting of

Population of Seychelles.

582 - - - White persons,

6,058 - - - Slaves; and

323 - - Coloured Free Persons.

"Throughout the habitations (meaning those belonging to the Slaves) there is the greatest disparity of numbers between Males and Females; the former are to the latter, generally speaking, as Five to One; and no increase of Population takes place."
