Mrs. Norman's daughter (a girl 15 or 16 years of age) came up to her, and saying, "You must not chat with my mother," boxed her on the face. Mr. Norman was sent for to the Customhouse; when he came home, he asked what was the matter? Hollo! Hollo! he struck her on the face; locked her up; let her out on Thursday morning, and she set about getting breakfast ready; went up stairs to make the beds; was asked to get a tub of water for bathing the children, said she could not carry water on her head, her neck being sore from the stroke of the sweeping brush she had received the day before; was asked to put an iron in the fire for clothes; her master took up a broom, and struck her on the head; she cried, and attempted to go to the Collector, but was seized by her master, who said the Collector had nothing to do with her; they tore her clothes; she escaped to the Collector, and complained; Collector desired her to go before a magistrate; it being rather late, would not go to her master's till to-morrow though desired by Collector; was forced home by three men, and was confined till Sunday morning; forced her way through a partition and escaped; was going to Parham to make her complaint to the Collector, but having gone about half a mile, was taken with fever and came back; went afterwards to the lodgings of one of the Commissioners and made her complaint; her name was taken down, and the name of her master, and she was desired to attend on Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock; on Monday was desired by a magistrate to return to her master's; she went to master's, but would not be received.

Being requested to go make up the beds, and desired not to be obstinate, she refused to go, asked her mistress if she was going to tear her clothes, and gathered up her clothes and threw them at her (Mrs. Norman.) Mrs. Norman denies positively that she ever struck Caroline with a brush, or otherwise. Caroline refused to iron clothes; Caroline did not strike her (Mrs. Norman.) Mrs. Norman said she would send for Mr. Norman; Caroline replied she did not care, that she had her knife, and was ready.

Mr. Norman states that he was called home on Wednesday; confined Caroline; confined her again on Thursday for refusing to do her work, until Sunday morning, when she escaped by breaking the partition; never struck Caroline with the hand, or otherwise. Applied to a magistrate on the Wednesday, who desired him to take her home, and whip her with tamarind rods. Gives her an allowance of 8 bits a week to support her; if she was good tempered, would be a tolerable servant; she is a turbulent girl, and has threatened more than once that she would destroy her master and the children. She attends the Moravians, and lives with an African apprentice named John (Roberts) as a wife.

*Remarks:—Extract of a Letter from Robert Horsford, Esq. the sitting magistrate, to George Wyke, Esq. Collector of the Customs, dated 15 May 1824:—"IT appeared that Mrs. Smith had given the woman some clothes to wash for her (Mrs. Smith's) children, against the Sunday morning, which the girl had neglected to do, and had devoted her time exclusively to preparing some things for her husband, to the utter omission of the work which had been assigned her. That Mrs. Smith, naturally prowoked at such neglect, had given the woman a single box on the ear, which was the foundation of her complaint. Mrs. Smith gave the woman a very good general character; and it appeared in evidence before me, that the African, as well as her child, had always experienced the kindest and most indulgent treatment at the hands of her mistress. Under these circumstances, I told the girl I considered her conduct to have been most ungrateful towards Mrs. Smith, the complaint as most frivolous, † and that had it not been for the general good character she bore, I certainly should have felt it my duty to punish her, an expression which any rational person would construe, rather as a cautionary threat, than as one intended to be carried into execution. The probability of my mentioning that species of punishment, which Miss Smith's treacherous memory will at once be refuted by my informing you, that it is my invariable practice to avoid inflicting corporal punishment upon females of any description; but upon misdemeanors being proved before me, that I constantly sentence them to the stocks, solitary confinement, &c. &c; and that since I have had the honour of holding His Majesty's Commission as a magistrate for this Colony, I have only once been compelled to have recourse to that species of punishment towards a female, and that only under circumstances of the highest aggravation."
