## SLAVES.

RETURN to an Address of The Honourable House of Commons, dated 8th May 1827;—for

AN ACCOUNT of all SUMS OF MONEY which have been paid at any time by Great Britain, as Bounties for or in respect of Slaves found or captured in any Vessels engaged in the illegal traffic in Slaves.

IT not being practicable to confine the Account merely to "Slaves found or captured in any Vessels," the following is,—

AN ACCOUNT of all Sums which have been at any time paid as Bounties for Slaves seized, either for a breach of the Abolition Laws. or for violation of the Treaties with Foreign Powers.
