ALL those against which no remarks are made, have been Manumitted by persons in England, and the Deed is generally worded, in consideration of faithful services. The Slaves are, in the first instance, conveyed by the Owners to such persons for the express purpose of being Manumitted, but as these conveyances are seldom or never recorded, it is impossible to give a correct answer. The Fee or Tax for registering each Deed of Manumission, is 37*s.* 6*d.* currency, if it be executed in England, and 30*s.* for all others; all those against which 50*l.* or more, are remarked as paid to the churchwarden, is so paid by the owner of the Slave, and are, according to the law of the Island; and the person so Manumitted, receives an annual interest of eight per cent on the sum so paid.

King's House Jamaica,
13th Nov. 1826.

MY LORD,

REFERRING to your Lordship's dispatch of the 11th April, last marked circular, inclosing an extract from an Address of the House of Commons of the 21st of the preceding month, calling for a Return of the Number of Slaves Manumitted in each Colony in each year for the last five years, distinguishing the number who have paid for their Manumission, and, if possible, the average amount paid by each, from those emancipated by their masters, and males from females; I have the honour to inform your Lordship that, having already transmitted a similar Return made up to March last, I conceived it unnecessary to embrace, in the accompanying Return, a longer period of time than from the last Return to 30th June last.

I enclose for your Lordship's information, an account rendered to me by the Island Secretary for preparing the accompanying Return, verified upon oath, in the same manner as was observed in regard to the two other returns which have already been sent to your Lordship's department.

After the month of March 1824, no colonial duty was levied on manumissions, except for foreign slaves. The amount received in 1825, was entirely on account of slaves belonging to Martinique, who were manumitted by their owners in St. Lucia.

The above is taken from the requêtes which have been lodged in the Secretary's office. It is impossible to give the average amount paid by each slave for his manumission, as there is no document in office to afford the required information, neither is there any means of obtaining it.
