Of all BOUNTIES paid on Slaves captured since the last Return; viz. March 1822.

From the Collector's Roll, of the Number of Slaves on the Estate of *Bel Ombre*, in the District of Savanne, in the Mauritius; distinguishing the Males from the Females, and the Creole from Foreign, in each Year, from 1814 to the latest period at which it can be given, with the Names of the Proprietors at each Period; specifying also the Number of Slaves born, dying, purchased or sold, in each Year, and the Name of the Person from whom, and of the Estate from which, they were thus sold or bought, and the Ages, Sexes and Country of the Slaves thus transferred.

MY LORD,

WITH reference to my Despatches to your Lordship, and to complete the Returns called for by your Lordship's Despatches, dated 1st and 15th April 1826, and by the Resolutions of the House of Commons which accompanied them, I have now the honour to transmit to your Lordship the following Statements and Papers; viz.

N° 1.—STATEMENT of the Slave Population of *Mauritius* at the time of the Capture, and at all intervening periods at which a Census has been made up, as shown by the Returns of the Proprietors and by the Collector's Tax Roll; together with a Return of the Slave Population at the *Seychelles*, as far as the same can be obtained from the Collector's Books.

N° 2, 3, 4, and 5.—RETURNS of the Slave Population at the *Seychelles* Islands, as far as the same can be made up, from the period of their Capture.

N° 6.—REGULATIONS in force respecting the removal of Slaves from one Property to another.

N° 7.—RETURN of all Bounties paid on Slaves captured, since the year 1817.

The Honourable A. W. Blane, Esq. Acting Chief Secretary to Government.

Sir,

I AM at length enabled to reply definitively to your Letter of the 26th July 1826, conveying his Excellency the Governor's orders relative to several Resolutions of the House of Commons, on the subject of Returns required from this Department.

With reference to my letter of the 31st August 1826, complying partially with the above orders, and transmitting two Returns, the one relating to the Bel Ombre Estate, the other to the Seychelles Islands, it only remained for me to furnish a "Return of the Slave Population of the Isle of France, as stated in the Collector's " Tax Roll; distinguishing the Male from the Female; distinguishing also the " Population of each District; from the time of the Capture to the latest period at " which it can be given."

It was not in my power to furnish this Return in a perfect state, because the Collector's Tax Rolls do not specify the proportion of male and female slaves, but only the total number; but as the Tax Rolls were made up from the Returns of the proprietors of slaves, furnished periodically, and which remain deposited in this office, it became my duty to have recourse to them.

In fulfilment, therefore, of the objects comprehended in the Resolution of the House of Commons above recited, as far as circumstances would permit, I have prepared, and now do myself the honour to transmit to you the following Returns; viz.

RETURN of the Slave Population of the *Isle of France*, comprising, 1st, the Number of Slaves, as shown by the Returns of the Proprietors, denominated Annual Returns, which remain deposited in the Internal Revenues Office; distinguishing the Male from the Female; distinguishing also the Population of each District; from the time of the Capture to the latest period at which it can be given: 2dly, The Number of Slaves as stated in the Collector's Tax Rolls for the same period, and in the same form as the above Statement; but differing from it in this respect, that the proportions of Male and Female Slaves which are not stated in the Tax Rolls have been derived from an approximate Calculation founded upon the general results of the Proprietors Returns.

Although every exertion has been made to expedite the business to which this duty has given rise, it has not been in my power, notwithstanding the partial aid afforded me by Government for this purpose, to bring it to an earlier conclusion.

Again referring to my letter of the 31st August 1826, I further inclose a Return of the Population of the *Seychelles Islands*, which I request may be substituted for the one formerly transmitted; because, since the period alluded to, I have received duplicates Recensements of the inhabitants of those Islands for the year 1826, and am enabled to extend the Return accordingly.

REMARKS:—The annual Census is an institution of long standing. In first establishing and since supporting it, the Colonial Government appears to have had several objects in view connected with the population, and with the general state of the Colony; but the chief of these objects has, no doubt, been the raising of the Public Revenue, of which the capitation taxes upon slaves have long formed a principal part.

But from the commencement, it cannot, I apprehend, be stated that this object has at any period been fulfilled in a perfect manner. The Returns of the slave proprietors have never been considered accurate. Since the Capture, they have certainly not been so. Subsequently to that event, during the

the first years, whilst every thing as yet remained in an unsettled state, it is not surprising that many persons should have failed to furnish their Returns, and also that many of the Returns furnished should have been inaccurate. In later years the number of persons who have failed to recense has been less considerable, and the Returns have probably been more accurate, but still the truth has not been ascertained. The taxes being levied according to the total number of slaves returned, it is the interest of the proprietor to diminish this number, and he may sometimes on this account have been induced to make exceptions in his Return, particularly of infant and of aged and infirm slaves, who are rather a charge than productive of profit to their possessors.

The preceding Account—continued.

In the foregoing Statement it will be observed that the Collector's Tax Rolls and the Returns of the Proprietors of Slaves do not agree in their results, although it has been stated that these Returns form the ground-work upon which the Tax Rolls are established ; and it is proper that this difference should be explained.

There are two causes for the difference alluded to : the first is, that the Returns are no longer in so perfect a state as they were at the period when the Tax Rolls were established, particularly those of the first years after the Capture. It has been ascertained that some portion of the Returns has been destroyed by rats and other vermin, and some portion by the rain, which has penetrated into the building in which they were deposited, during the hurricanes by which this colony has been visited ; and it is possible also that some Returns may have been lost or mislaid in the course of the frequent use for reference to which they have been subjected during so long a period.

The second cause is the circumstance of the Tax Rolls having received additions, whilst no such additions have been made to the Returns. In consequence of many persons having failed to furnish their Returns with regularity in successive years, it has frequently happened that persons have been called

called upon or have presented themselves to pay their taxes, whose names appeared in the Tax Roll of one year but not in that of another, in which they should have existed. In such cases the collector has required the individuals alluded to to declare the number of slaves they possessed in those years when their names did not appear in the Tax Rolls, which declaration has been entered on the face of the Tax Rolls, and the taxes have been levied accordingly. In another point of view, also, the accuracy of the above Statement must be regarded with hesitation, namely, with reference to the proportions of Male and Female Slaves therein exhibited, because the Returns of the Proprietors, from which they are derived in many cases, bear obvious marks of imperfection. The general result, however, may not be very inaccurate. With reference to the number of slaves stated in the foregoing Return, under the head of Port Louis and Suburbs, as appearing in the Returns of the Proprietors and in the Tax Rolls, it may be proper to explain that the proprietors of several small islands, dependencies of the Mauritius, whose fixed place of residence is Port Louis, have been in the habit of returning the slaves established in those islands, and of paying taxes upon them, as if they actually composed part of the slave population of Port Louis. In order to explain this case more fully, a Return is annexed, exhibiting in detail the Names of the Islands in question, the Number of Slaves annually returned, and the Number borne on the Tax Rolls.

BUT the Collector cannot furnish the Return called for from the Seychelles in a perfect state, and is therefore under the necessity of transmitting only such part of the information required as the documents in his possession enable him to do.

The documents which he has referred to consist of a List of the number of Slaves between seven and sixty years of age, for 1818, which is headed thus:—" Etat " général des Contibuables aux Isles Seychelles, et le Nombre de Noirs qu'ils " possèdent pendant l'année 1818 ;" and the duplicate Returns of the inhabitants furnished to the Collector of Taxes at the Seychelles, for the years 1824, 1825 and 1826 :

Sir,

IN obedience to the commands of his Excellency the Govenor, conveyed to me in the Chief Secretary's letter, under date the 20th of August last, which I received on the 14th instant, I have the honour to forward to you, subjoined, the Returns as under.

Mr. Madge, who left this for Mauritius on the 30th of August, on board His Majesty's colonial brig Wizard, took with him the best data that could be procured respecting the Slave Population of these islands, from their Capture to the year 1818, the Census of 1815 included; also a Statement of the Number of Slaves shipped from Seychelles since 1818 to the latest period; an Account of the Number of Slaves landed at Seychelles; as likewise a Statement of Blacks captured and sent to Mauritius at various periods.

ARCHIPELAGO OF SEYCHELLES.

REGULATIONS in force with respect to removing Slaves from one Island to another.

To remove Slaves from Mahé to the Amirantes Islands, it is necessary to obtain the authority of the Government Agent, as "possessing the chief civil command."

They are then expedited by the officer charged with the Customs, agreeably to the 5th Geo. IV. c. 113, certificates having been previously obtained by the Proprietors from the person charged with the Registration Department.

Proprietors may remove their slaves at pleasure from one island to another, situated within twelve leagues of Mahé, on board of vessels under the burthen of fifteen tons.

Slaves cannot be embarked for Mauritius unless the permission of his Excellency the Governor has been previously obtained by the Proprietors.

Sir,

I HAVE had the honour to receive in communication a copy of the Chief Secretary's letter of the 20th of August last, addressed to me as Government Agent at the Seychelles Islands, requiring a Return of the Slave Population of those Islands as stated in the Collector's Tax Rolls ; distinguishing the Males from the Females ; distinguishing also the Population of each District, from the time of the Capture to the latest period ; as well as a Statement of the Regulations which are in force with respect to Slaves removed from one property to another.

With respect to the Slave Population as above required, I beg leave to refer you to my Return dated the 29th of August last, furnished agreeably to the Chief Secretary's letter of the 25th of July 1826 ; and to add that, as taxes were first imposed at Seychelles by the Proclamations of Governor Farquhar, of the 3d and 4th of November 1817, to take effect from the 1st of January 1818, the Tax Rolls from that period only can be referred to for the purpose stated ; but as these are in the possession of the officer charged with the collection of those taxes at Seychelles, I have not the means, here, of furnishing any other information on this subject than that which is contained in my Return above alluded to.

On the subject of the Population of each District, from the time of the Capture to the latest period, I have to observe, that from the very limited extent of the Island of Mahé, the Slave Population there has never been classed by districts ; but at the neighbouring Islands it may, I conceive, be ascertained by reference to the annual Returns delivered to the Collector by the persons inhabiting such Islands, but which are, as above stated, in his possession at Seychelles.

Finally, as to the Regulations in force relative to the removal of Slaves from one property to another, none have ever been established, except in cases of transporting Slaves from one Island to another, by means of vessels employed in navigation, when the formalities prescribed by the Acts of the British Parliament have been always observed.

OBSERVATIONS explanatory of this Return.

THERE are no documents deposited in the archives of the Sychelles Islands to show that any census of the slave population there was taken between January 1810 and the year 1815. The increase, nevertheless, during this interval will, at a first view, appear remarkable. But it should be considered that the inhabitants had not only the whole of the year 1810 to carry on this traffic legally, but it may be presumed that as soon as the information reached them of the capture of the colony in December 1810, and their consequent submission to the English laws for the abolition of the slave trade, they did not fail to take advantage of the moment to increase their stock while their existed no officer appointed by Government to check them. Lieutenant Sullivan of the Royal Marines was placed in charge of these Islands on the 2d of June 1811. He was succeeded by Lieutenant Lesage of the 22d Regiment, whom I found there on the 7th of November 1814, when I arrived to take the command as Government Agent, under an appointment by His Majesty's Minister for the Colonies.

In May 1815 I received from the Government of Mauritius the registration ordinance of the 24th September 1814, and having carried it into execution in the course of the same year, there appeared by the recensements a general total of the slave population as stated in the Return for that period.

Mauritius.

Sir,

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated the 9th December last, requesting me to explain for the information of his Excellency the Governor, why the Returns of the Slave Population of these Islands, forwarded to you in September, were not prepared agreeably to the instructions conveyed in your letter of the 20th of August, and desiring me to prepare fresh Returns, if possible, distinguishing the Males from the Females, as also the Population of each District or Island.

By the Proclamation of the 4th November 1817, the Collector at Seychelles, is ordered to prepare annually a list of all Slaves subject to the Capitation Tax; viz. those above Seven years of Age and under Sixty, specifying the Names of the Proprietors of such Slaves, and the amount of the Taxes.

Conformably to these instructions I requested the inhabitants, on my arrival here in November 1817, to appear at my office with their recensements, from which a list was prepared in my presence, as directed by the Proclamation above mentioned, without paying the slightest regard to the difference of sex, or to the distribution of the population.

In this manner I continued to prepare the Tax Rolls, as well as the many difficulties I had to contend against would permit, up to the latter end of 1823, when I was supplied with printed forms from Mauritius, in which such distinctions were observed as have enabled me to prepare the accompanying Returns for 1824, 1825 and 1826, agreeably to the form laid down in your letter of the 20th of August.

I had hoped, by the assistance of various documents in my office, to have been enabled to give to the Tax Rolls previous to 1824 the form prescribed by the late Resolution of the House of Commons, but I have at length desisted, convinced that no reliance could be placed on their accuracy when finished. I am thus under the necessity of requesting, that you will consider the Tax Rolls for 1818, 1819, 1820, 1821, 1822 and 1823, forwarded to you in September last, as the only correct ones in my power to furnish, and however I may regret my inability, more fully to comply with the wishes of Government, in this instance, yet no blame I should hope will be imputed to me on that account. The Tax Rolls for the six years above alluded to having been prepared in strict conformity to the Proclamation of the 4th November 1817, which I imagined had no other end in view than to ascertain the annual amount of the Capitation Tax.

SUIVANT la lettre que Monsieur le Sécrétaire en Chef m'a adressée sous la date du 7 Août dernier, et sur laquelle il ne m'a pas été possible avant ce jour de fournir ma reponse, attendu le cours des affaires que j'ai été obligé de suivre.

J'ai été chargé de rappeler les dispositions des lois et réglements qui sont en force maintenant en cette île relativement au diverses manières dont les esclaves peuvent être transportés d'une propriété à un autre ; et dont la propriété d'un esclave peut être transmise d'un maître à un autre maître.

Je vous d'abord rapporter les Articles de l'édit de Décembre 1723, (Code Noir), qui ont quelque rapport à cette question :

Article 8. Les enfans qui naîtront des mariages entre les esclaves seront esclaves, et appartiendront aux maîtres des femmes esclaves, et non à ceux de leurs maris, si les maris et les femmes ont des maîtres differens.

Article 9. Si le mari esclave a épousé une femme libre, les enfans, tant mâles que femelles, ou filles, suivront la condition de leur mère, et seront libres comme elle, nonobstant la servitude de leur père ; et si le père est libre et que la femme soit esclave, les enfans seront esclaves pareillement.

Il y a observer sur cet article, que suivant les lois en vigueur une personne de la population blanche ne peut contracter mariage avec un individu de la population noire, soit libre soit esclave.

Il faut aussi concilier cet Article 9. avec la disposition de l'Article 5, du même édit, qui défend d'abord le mariage des blancs avec les noirs, et même toute union charnelle de la part des blancs et même des noirs affranchis ou nés libres avec les esclaves ; et qui veut, que s'il resultoit d'une pareille conjonction d'un maître avec son esclave des enfans, ils soient adjugés à l'hôpital du lieu, sans pouvoir jamais être affranchis ; néanmoins le noir affranchi ou libre se mariant avec les formalités prescrites pour un légitime mariage, avec l'esclave dont il a eu des enfans, rend dès-lors la femme libre, et les enfans deviennent aussi libres et légitimes par ce mariage.

Article 20. Un maître ne peut abandonner son esclave vieux ou infirme, pour être dispensé des soins qu'il lui doit ; s'il le fait, il perd la propriété de l'esclave, qui est adjugé à l'hôpital le plus proche, mais le maître est condamné à payer chaque jour une somme déterminée pour l'entretien de l'esclave.

L'Article 21, déclarant les esclaves incapables de disposer et contracter en leur nom, comme aussi de rien posséder en propriété ; s'il leur arrivait d'acquérir un esclave (ce qui n'est pas sans exempté). Cet esclave deviendrait la propriété du maître ; le propriétaire esclave ne pourrait ni en disposer par vente ou donation, ni le transmettre par voie de succession à ses enfans.

Il faut cependant reconnoître que jamais le maître qui a permis à son esclave d'acheter de ses épargnes un noir esclave ne s'est prévalu du droit que lui donne cet article.

Il est même douteux, si l'on permettroit à l'héritier ou au successeur d'un propriétaire qui auroit permis à son esclave d'acquérir et posséder un esclave de s'emparer ainsi de l'esclave acquis, et de s'en attribuer la propriété, encore que ce soit la conséquence rigoureuse du principe dans l'usage ou en restreint et ou en modère l'exécution.

L'Article 39, est celui que l'on peut regarder comme le plus considérable sur cette matière ; il veut que les esclaves soient reputés meubles. C'est à dire, que tous

les caractères et les effets que les lois attachent aux choses mobiliaires s'appliquent aux esclaves. Ils entrent dans les partages de succession comme objets mobiliers ; ils sont saisis et vendus à la poursuite des créances comme meubles ; ils sont vendus livres comme meubles.

L'Article 42. contient une restriction importante et salutaire, et est bien dans l'esprit de ces anciennes loix sur le régime des esclaves.

Le mari, sa femme mariée en mariage légitime, et leurs enfans impubères, ne peuvent être saisis et vendus séparément s'ils sont sous la puissance du même maître ; toute vente forcée ou volontaire qui serait faite contrairement à cette disposition est déclarée nulle.

Ceux des esclaves, dans le cas de cet article, qui auroient été séparés contre le vœu de la loi, seront adjugés et appartiendront aux acquéreurs sans qu'ils soient tenus de tenir compte d'aucun supplément du prix.

Article 43, non moins important ; il défend de saisir immobilièrement et de vendre judiciairement les fonds et habitations sans y comprendre les noirs esclaves qui y sont attachés et y travaillent actuellement, et qui sont de l'âge de quatorze ans jusqu'à soixante.

Cet article défend aussi textuellement de saisir les noirs esclaves de l'âge ci-dessus attachés aux fonds ou habitation set y travaillant pour les faire vendre séparément ; il permet cependant à celui qui a vendu les esclaves et à qui le prix en est dû de suivre sur eux le privilège de vendeur et de les faire vendre séparément pour être payé de ce qui lui est dû ; mais il ne peut les distraire d'une saisie réelle, c'est-à-dire, qui comprendroit les fonds et les esclaves.

L'Article 46. va plus loin et est plus explicatif encore ; il entend que dans la distribution entre les créanciers du prix d'une habitation saisie et vendue avec les esclaves, on ne puisse distinguer ce qui est le prix de la terre et ce qui provient de la valeur des esclaves.

Ceci a donné lieu à un doute qui est de savoir, s'il est permis à un notaire qui passe un contrât de vente d'une habitation vendue, conjointement avec des esclaves y attachés, d'exprimer un prix pour le fonds en particulier, et un prix distinct pour les noirs.

Le motif est en ce cas que le droit d'enrégistrement ne soit payé que comme sur une vente de meuble sur les esclaves, parce qu'il est moindre alors.

Il y a encore un autre motif celui de pouvoir stipuler en même tems que les premiers payemens seront imputés sur le prix des esclaves, qui sont perissables et disponibles, car il est libre à l'acquéreur dès qu'il est devenue propriétaire de vendre les esclaves séparément de la terre ; ce qui est un très grand inconvenient, et pour la sûreté du vendeur, et pour la destination des noirs, et pour la culture ; il n'y a point de loi ni de jurisprudence qui défende aux notaires d'insérer de telles clauses dans les contrâts de vente d'habitation, ni qui rende nulle de telles stipulations ; il y a plus, par une clause expresse les noirs seroient-ils déclarés immobilisés avec le fond, et l'acquéreur s'engagerait-il à n'en vendre aucun avant l'entier acquittement du prix, la vente et la tradition qui serait faite ensuite d'un ou plusieurs de ces noirs ne pourroit pas ce semble être annulée à l'égard du tiers qui les auroit achetés, à cause de leur nature spécifique de meubles. Une loi positive pourrait seule devenir sur ce point une règle obligatoire, et qui aurait la force d'annuler de telles ventes.

L'Article 49. est à considérer ; il admet d'abord que tout propriétaire ayant atteint la majorité d'âge (alors 25 ans, aujourd'hui 21,) peut accorder l'affranchissement à ses esclaves même par un simple testament, mais ensuite il veut que l'autorité interviennent pour examiner si les motifs exposés par les maîtres pour affranchir leurs esclaves sont légitimes ; ainsi pour tout affranchissement depuis cet édit, il faut la

permission de l'autorité, c'est-à-dire, du gouverneur ; et de plus, qu'il ne soit préjudiciable à aucun créancier du maître qui veut affranchir son esclave, et qui suivant les lois en vigueur, a le droit d'y former opposition.

Le même Article contient une disposition à laquelle on a toujours attaché une grande importance, il regarde comme illicite et dangereux que des maîtres soient assez mercenaires pour mettre la liberté de leurs esclaves à prix ce qui les porte aux vols et aux brigandages.

Il y a toutes fois jurement des exemples que l'on contrevient à cet article, ce qui est d'autant plus facile qu'il n'est pas nécessaire que la condition imposée par le maître à l'esclave soit connue et exprimée. Il n'est que trop vrai aussi que l'inconvénient et le danger que la loi a voulu éviter par la tolérance qu'on y apporte ne se vérissent que trop souvent ; ce danger n'existera plus dès-lors qu'il sera permis aux esclaves de se former par des voies légitimes une sorte de pécule dont on examinera la source lorsqu'il sera question de les affranchir, ce ne sera pas alors avec la cupidité du maître qu'ils auront à traiter pour leur affranchissement. l'Article 50. porte que les esclaves qui auront été nommés par les maîtres tuteurs de leurs enfans seront dès-lors reputés affranchis.

Cet article, imité du droit Romain, n'a jamais eu aucune application dans la Colonie ; le noir esclave a toujours été regardé comme incapable de remplir aucune charge publique, et la tutelle étoit une charge en outre, la tutelle étant ce que dans le droit on appelle *dative*, c'étoit le conseil de famille qui déferait la tutelle et non le testament du père.

J'ajouterais quelques détails encore pour que la matière soit complète autant que possible.

Dans les contrats et apports de mariage, selon les termes de la stipulation, les noirs esclaves demeurent en propre à la femme, ou sont censés aliénés au mari ; des pères et mères sont vendus à leurs enfans libres ou affranchis, avec ou sans la condition de leur donner la liberté, et de même des enfans esclaves sont achetés par leur père ou mère, avec ou sans la même condition.

Un noir qui n'est point réclamé par son maître peut, après un laps de tems fixé, être vendu en public. C'est ce que l'on appelle épave, et le produit en est dévolu au domaine ou au Roi.

Le Fisc peut encore, pour cause de non payment des contributions ou autres redévancess publiques, saisir et faire vendre le nombre d'esclaves nécessaire et jusqu'à concurrence de la somme due.

Mais il doit exercer cette saisie sur les noirs attachés au service domestique avant de pouvoir saisir les noirs attachés au sol et à la culture.

Je terminerai par un cas singulier ; la propriété d'un individu esclave peut être réclamée par deux maîtres, tous les deux ont acquis et possédé l'identité, est reconnue ; si celui qui a la possession actuelle a possédé pendant trois ans, il est préféré pour la propriété et son titre est confirmé.
