To which I have also added, a Return of the Government Blacks at the Seychelles Islands at the time of their capture, and at the present period.

It has therefore been necessary to commence from this period, when the only correct Return is to be found in the Matricule Registers, signed by Mr. Mackay, who it appears was the first to introduce some order and regularity in the details of this Department.

Seychelles Islands.

At the capture of the Seychelles Islands, there were delivered over to the British Government seven Blacks and two Negresses, two of the former were shortly after emancipated. In 1815, five of the above mentioned Blacks, and two Negresses, were recensé as belonging to Government, and were attached to the service of the Government Agent, since which two of the Blacks and the two Negresses have died, and have been thus reported in the Triennial Returns. There consequently still remain three Government Blacks at those Islands, who are in the service of the Government Agent and clothed and fed at his own expense.

TERMS upon which the Boys and Girls of the Matricule are to be intrusted to the charge of individuals, whose applications to that effect Government may have approved of, agreeably to the Public Advertisement of 5th February 1824.

The Masters, in either case, to provide the boys or girls so apprenticed to trades, or hired out as servants, with food and clothing until the age of fourteen, when Government will either sanction their being retained at the usual rate of hire by the respective parties, or if it should be deemed expedient, retain them.

In case of ill treatment on the part of the masters or mistresses of the boys or girls, of which on inquiry His Excellency the Governor will decide himself, they will be withdrawn by Government, and the parties will be proceeded against accordingly.

The boys are in every case to be taught by their masters or mistresses to read, and the girls to be invariably instructed in needlework, and both boys and girls are to receive from their masters or mistresses religious instructions.

They are to be produced to the Superintendent of Matricule for examination every six months, in order that he may report on the progress they may have made in their respective trades or occupations for the information of His Excellency the Governor.

We, the undersigned, being desirous of taking charge of the boy or girl, as named in the margin, as a servant, or for the purpose of teaching him or her the trade of (*vide margin*), and having read over carefully the conditions and obligations contained in the above paper, I hereby promise, engage, and bind myself strictly to conform to and fulfil all and every the aforesaid conditions and obligations, distinctly understanding and acknowledging the right of Government to withdraw the aforesaid boy or girl, in case of ill treatment, or failure of these conditions on my part, or upon any other grounds; and further, that I acknowledge, and declare myself subject to all and every such penalties as the law inflicts in consequence of harsh or cruel treatment of the boy or girl confided to my charge.

IN answer to your letter of the 10th instant, referring to a letter from the Harbour Master, stating, that at a general muster of Government Apprentices in 1822, the Purser of His Majesty's ship Menai reported to the Collector of Customs that 10 of the black apprentices who had served on board the Menai and Wizard were then missing, and that the said apprentices were marked off accordingly on Mr. Davis's list, and requesting me to transmit, for his Excellency the Governor's information, a copy of any report which may have been made to the collector on this subject by the Harbour Master, or by the officers of His Majesty's navy on the station, as well as with a copy of any report or observations which may, as connected with this matter, have been addressed by the collector to the authorities in England:

I have the honour to acquaint you, that on reference to the books and other documents kept in this office, I am unable to discover any report made to the collector by the Harbour Master, or the officers of His Majesty's navy on the station, on the subject alluded to, neither can I discover any report or observations made by the collector to the authorities in England, unless the observations contained in the enclosed (copies) taken from the Inspection Returns made in the latter part of 1821, 1823 and 1825.

Mr. Chignard, the apprentice clerk, informs me that he recollects perfectly of Mr. Sholl, the purser of the Menai, calling at the Custom House, reporting verbally to Mr. Davis that 10 of the apprentices were missing; and at the same time mentioned to Mr. Davis that Captain Moresby had reported the matter officially, in a letter to the Chief Secretary to Government, accompanied with an extract from the log-book of the Menai.*
