Barbadoes, 27 October 1832. My Lord, I HAVE had the honour to receive your Lordship's circular despatch of the 2d of last August, enclosing the copy of an order of the House of Commons, dated the 25th of July; and herewith I take the liberty of transmitting the information which I have obtained on the subject of it.

Barbadoes: - In the Court of Vice-Admiralty Instance Court.

At an Instance Court of Vice-Admiralty in this Island of Barbadoes established, held at the Town-hall in Bridge Town, on Wednesday the 18th day of February, in the year of our Lord 1829;

Present, the Honourable John Alleyne Beckles, sole Judge of His Majesty's Court of Vice-Admiralty for this Island established; John Chose Eversley, esq, Deputy Registrar; Patrick Joseph D. Lynch, esq., Deputy Marshal; Thomas Challenor, esq., Acting Collector, for and in behalf of His Majesty, and a certain coloured female, named Susanna, seized by the said Thomas Challenor, Acting Collector of His Majesty's Customs for the port of Bridge Town, in the said Island of Barbadoes; Thomas Challenor, esq., Acting Collector of His Majesty's Customs for the port of Bridge Town, in the said Island of Barbadoes, and for

and in behalf of His said Majesty.

An information was produced by the said Thomas Challenor against a certain coloured female named Susanna, as forfeited to His Majesty for having been imported and brought into the said Island of Barbadoes from the Island of Curaçoa, the said Island of Curaçoa being an Island in the West Indies not in the dominion, possession or occupation of His Majesty, and for being there, in the said Island of Barbadoes, sold and disposed of as a slave; and further for being there, in the said Island of Barbadoes, placed, detained and kept in a state of slavery, contrary to the provisions of a certain Act or Statute of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 47th year of the reign of our late Sovereign Lord George the Third, intituled "An Act for the Abolition of the Slave Trade," and of one other Act or Statute of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws relating to the Abolition of the Slave Trade."

The Judge having heard the information read, and no claim having been interposed, and

the time limited by law for interposing a claim having expired, and Elizabeth Howard Austin, otherwise called Betsy Austin, in the said information mentioned, having been thrice called and not appearing; and Matthew Coulthurst, esq., His Majesty's Advocate-general and John Paynter Musson, esq., His Majesty's Attorney-general, having severally addressed the Court in behalf of the seizor, was pleased to pronounce the said coloured female, named Susanna, to be forfeited, as prayed in the said information; and did condemn, adjudge and decree the said coloured female, named Susanna, to be forfeited to the sole use of His Majesty King George the Fourth, his heirs and successors, for the purposes, and to be disposed of as the law in that behalf directs.

RETURN of all Natives of Africa condemned as Prize of War or Forfeiture in the Vice-Admiralty Court of this Island, since the 1st day of May 1807, conformable to the 47 Geo. 3, or Abolition Act, and delivered over to the President Spooner, temporary Governor, and then to the Collector of His Majesty's Customs for the Port of Bridgetown, as directed by His Majesty's Order in Council, dated the 16th March 1808; stating the Number of such Africans given by the Collector to his Excellency the Commander of the Forces, as Black Soldiers, &c. and the Number put out Apprentices by the Collector.

My Lord, Government-house, Bahamas, 17th November 1832.

No. 3. BAHAMAS.

With reference to your Lordship's circular of the 2d August 1832, I have the honour to forward the Returns from the Court of Vice-Admiralty of this colony, affording the information required by the Resolutions of the House of Commons of the 25th of July of the present year; and by which it would appear, that 457 negroes, captured by ships belonging to His Majesty, were condemned by the Court of Vice-Admiralty in these islands, and were consequently liberated during the last war; and that 136 slaves, from the commencement of the same period to the present time, have been condemned to the Crown, for infractions of the consolidated law for the abolition of the traffic in slaves, and have also in consequence received their freedom.

King's-House, Jamaica, 21st October 1832.

In conformity to the directions conveyed to me in your Lordship's circular despatch of the 2d of August last, transmitting an order of the House of Commons, dated the 25th of July, I have the honour to enclose a Return of the Captured Negroes who have been liberated in this island.

These negroes had become forfeited to the Crown at different periods, under the Abolition Acts, and received certificates of freedom at the dates specified in the Return. Some of them having had children born since their capture, who were liberated with them, a List of these children is added to the Return.

No negroes coming under the description of Crown Slaves have been liberated in Jamaica, there being none in the island when the orders for the emancipation of such persons were received.
