(6.)-SUMS charged for Breaking up the VESSEL, pursuant to the Act.

Extract from Mr. Rothery's Report, dated 11th March 1846:

"THE marshal has also charged 22l. 19 s. for possession of the vessel from the 18th of June to the 30th of September, 102 days, at 4s. 6d. per day, which is agreeably to the Table of Fees; but he is not, in addition thereto, also to charge the man he hires to keep possession of the vessel, which he has done. And again he has charged 23l. 11 s. for breaking up the vessel, 314 tons, at 1s. 6d. per ton; whereas your Lordships will find amongst the items in Mr. Watkins's account of 108l. 9 s., the following items:

"I am therefore of opinion that the charge made by the marshal cannot be sustained without further and more satisfactory explanation."
