The difference between the number of slaves captured and the number emancipated in any case shows, as a general rule, the number whe have died between the times of capture and of condemnation.

It will be seen that in several cases where slaves have been captured and condemned, no slave bounties have been awarded; this arises from the fact that captors have the option of claiming the bounty of 4L a ton on the tonnage of the vessel, in lies of the bounty of 5L a head on the slaves, if they think fit to do so, and they always do, if the former exceeds the latter.

In order to make the return complete I have added a column for "Observations."
